What is Sports Premium?

The Government provides funding to provide new, sustainable and substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly met and provided by the Departments for Education, Health & Culture and Media and Sport - and shall see money going directly to primary school Headteachers and Principals to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision at Frinton-on-Sea Primary School.
